

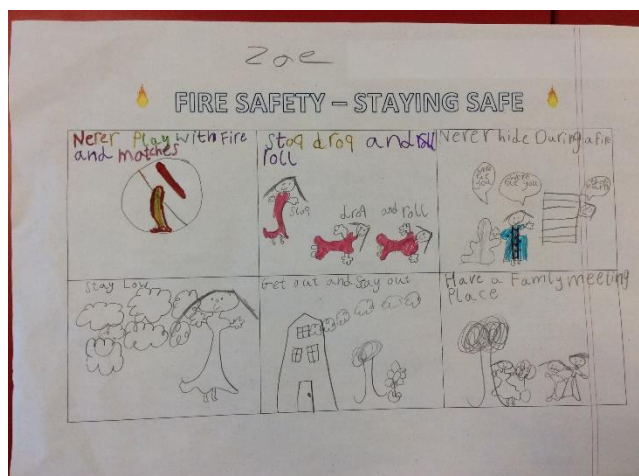


Holy Cross RC Primary School

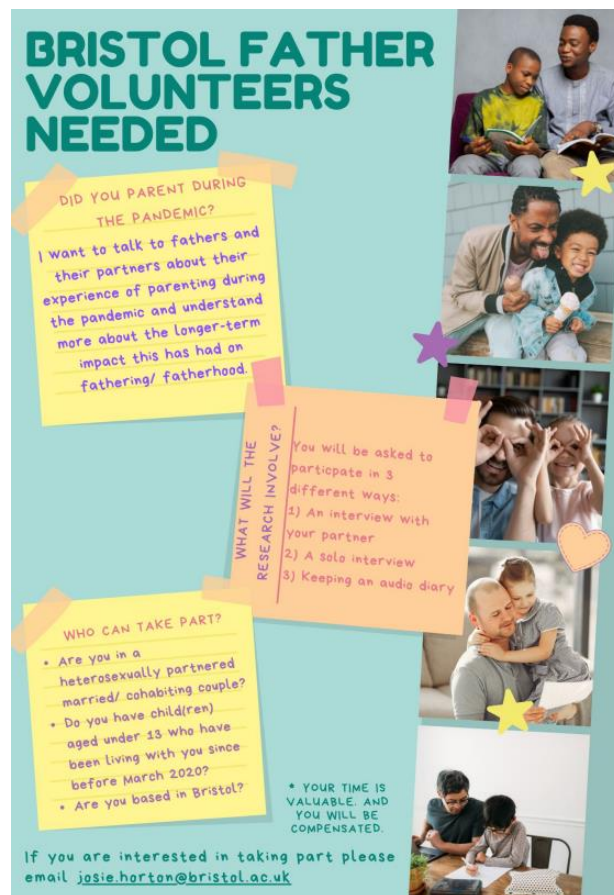

Free Childcare places for 2-year olds in Bristol:

There are hundreds of free early education and childcare places available in Bristol for two-year-olds. Funding is available for two-year-olds to receive up to 15 hours per week of free childcare at a range of early year providers, including Children's Centres, nurseries, pre-schools, playgroups and childminders. The rising cost of living is affecting a huge number of people across Bristol. With childcare costs also increasing, we want to make sure that families are getting the help and support they need. If you are a parent or carer of a two-year-old and you receive one of the following benefits, you could be entitled to a free place for your child:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Universal Credit, and your household income is £15,400 a year or less after tax, not including benefit payments
- child tax credits, and your household income is £16,190 a year or less before tax
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- the Working Tax Credit 4-week run on (the payment you get when you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

Bristol Welcoming Spaces:

The first of Bristol's Welcoming Spaces are now open. As the cost of fuel and food continues to rise, a network of warm, Welcoming Spaces has been set up for people to go to, to alleviate cost of living pressures this autumn and winter. Each venue will be responding to community priorities which means what happens in each space will vary, but is likely to include wi-Fi, access to electrical charging points, activities and community meals. There will also be support and practical advice provided by city-wide organisations. Dinosaur Takeover Week at Bristol Museum & Art Gallery

The ever-popular annual Dinosaur Takeover Week at Bristol Museum & Art Gallery is coming soon! During Dinosaur Takeover Week, children will be immersed in the world of dinosaurs as they investigate fantastic fossils, the work of a palaeontologist, dinosaur food chains and reptile remains. Children will:

Meet university experts, ask and answer questions about dinosaurs, explore Bristol Museum's wildlife and dinosaur galleries, work in groups, rotating through four different activities:

- Dinosaur dig: a mock palaeontologist's excavation (complete with hard hats!)
- Food Chain Facts: investigation of dinosaurs' eating habits
- Fantastic Fossils: handling a selection of plant and animal fossils
- Battle of the Dinosaurs: discover the fiercest, tallest, heaviest dinosaur using gallery exhibits

Duration: 90 minutes

Attendance update:

We are working in partnership with parents, carers and Bristol City Council to ensure all of our pupils maximise their attendance. We would like to thank parents and carers for the work you have done in ensuring your children have received education over the last few challenging years due to the pandemic. The usual rules on school attendance continue to apply, including:

- parents' duty to send their child to school regularly where they are of compulsory school age;
- schools' responsibilities to record attendance and follow up absence
- the availability of local authorities to use legal sanctions, including penalty notices and prosecution in court

If you are worried about your child attending school the first port of call is to discuss your concerns with us directly. Our staff who may be able to help, and all schools work closely with health and council teams who may also be able to help if needed. If you need to request time off for exceptional circumstance, please ask Miss Sims for a request of absence form. We would like to remind you that only requests for exceptional circumstances will be authorised. If your request is unauthorised, the absence will be looked at and if your child has more than 4 days off within a 10 week period, you could receive a penalty notice.

Thank you to those who attend regularly. Please remember to phone the school office if your child is going to be absent. If we do not hear from you, we will ring you and then may also make a home visit if we are unable to contact you.

Thank you to those who arrive on time. Remember, children can go straight to class from 8:45am or attend breakfast club from 8am if necessary. If we receive pupil premium funding for your child then breakfast club is free. If your child is constantly late to school this can affect their self-esteem and they could be missing out on valuable reading, phonics or Maths activities and interventions.

Today we have sent out letters to parents whose children have attendance below 90% (this means that children are persistently absent) and below 96% (this means that children do not attend school regularly). If you would like to make an appointment and create an action plan for the rest of the year, please speak to Miss Sims. We understand that it is only Term 1 and a few absences does amount to more percentage missed but we have a duty to inform you when your child has low attendance throughout the academic year. We hope that we can work with parents and support them to improve attendance.
