### **This week:**

### **Class information:**

Class teachers have sent out their termly newsletter today with PE days and other important information. It will also be saved on the school website under their class page. On Tuesday after school, each class teacher, from Y1 to Y6, will hold a 'Meet the teacher' session for all parents who are able to attend. This will be a general information evening about the class and year ahead. Individual parents' evening appointments to discuss your child's progress will be held in October.



## **PE:**

Formal PE lessons will start next week. This is to ensure that all children have the correct PE kit. Children will need to come to school in their PE kits on their PE days.

The correct PE kit is navy shorts, joggers or skort, a white T shirt and trainers or daps. Children should also wear their school sweatshirt or a navy hoodie during the colder months.

If you are finding it difficult to get a PE kit, please let us know by Wednesday of next week so we can help. Children will not be allowed to wear football shirts or multi-coloured leggings/joggings.

## **School Shoes:**

Please remember that correct school uniform includes plain black school shoes. Children are not to wear trainers or different coloured shoes. If you are having difficulty getting plain school shoes, please speak to your child's class teacher.

This is an informal opportunity for parents/carers of children with SEND to meet our new SENDCo Mrs Hunt, connect with other families and share experiences. We will be joined by a member of Bristol charity 'Send and You' who will share information about their services and the different ways that they can support parents/carers. An invitation to this event will be sent via text to families of children with SEND.



## **ELSA Room**

Our school ELSA room is located by the Key Stage two classrooms. It is run by Mrs Krzysiek who is our trained Emotional Literacy Support Assistant lead (ELSA). The classroom offers a safe, nurturing environment for all children and contains kitchen facilities, a cosy corner, a classroom desk area and a dedicated outdoor space. We provide individual ELSA sessions in the mornings and group sessions in the afternoons. These sessions offer support for a range of areas including; emotional literacy, self-esteem, social skills, friendship issues, managing strong feelings, anxiety and loss and bereavement. The aim is to build your child's emotional wellbeing, giving them the tools to cope with life's challenges and reach their potential academically. You will receive a letter if your child is timetabled for an ELSA session.

Mrs Krzysiek is also available for a meeting with parents if you would like to discuss your child's emotional wellbeing. She is available from 8.30am – 9.00am and 3.00pm – 4.30pm. If you cannot attend in the allocated times, please speak to Miss Sims and we will arrange a suitable time for you.

### **Attendance update:**

We are working in partnership with parents, carers and Bristol City Council to ensure all of our pupils maximise their attendance. We would like to thank parents and carers for the work you have done in ensuring your children have received education over the last few challenging years due to the pandemic. Now that the circumstances have changed, it is vital for all children to return to schools and other settings to minimise as far as possible the longer-term impact of the pandemic on their education, wellbeing and wider development. The usual rules on school attendance continue to apply, including:

- parents' duty to send their child to school regularly where they are of compulsory school age;
- schools' responsibilities to record attendance and follow up absence
- the availability of local authorities to use legal sanctions, including penalty notices and prosecution in court.

If you are worried about your child attending school the first port of call is to discuss your concerns with us directly. Our staff who may be able to help, and all schools work closely with health and council teams who may also be able to help if needed. If you need to request time off for exceptional circumstance, please ask Miss Sims for a request of absence form. We would like to remind you that only requests for exceptional circumstances will be authorised. If your request is unauthorised, the absence will be looked at and if your child has more than 4 days off within a 10 week period, you could receive a penalty notice.

Thank you to those who attend regularly. Please remember to phone the school office if your child is going to be absent. If we do not hear from you, we will ring you and then may also make a home visit if we are unable to contact you.

Thank you to those who arrive on time. Remember, children can go straight to class from 8:45am or attend breakfast club from 8am if necessary. If we receive pupil premium funding for your child then breakfast club is free. If your child is constantly late to school this can affect their self esteem and they could be missing out on valuable reading, phonics or Maths activities and interventions.

**However, please be aware of waiting 48 hours before your child returns to school if your child has had a tummy bug and if they have symptoms of Covid, we advise for you to lateral flow test them before leaving for school.**
